(1) Our School

Introduction

Our school is an aided co-educational school which was established by the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Hong Kong in 1959. We moved to a bigger site in Tin Shui Wai from Yuen Long in 1993. There are 30 classes from S1 to S6 (a total of 921 students).

School Mission

Our school strives to provide students with holistic Christian education to develop their God given potential to the fullest extent, nurture them to become enthusiastic learners and responsible citizens so as to glorify God and benefit mankind.

Teaching Staff Information

74 teachers were employed. 100% of them were Bachelor Degree holders while 28% of them held a Master Degree or above. 89% of them completed the Teacher Certificate / Diploma in Education. 39% of them have over 10 years teaching experience.

Facilities

With a new annex built since 1995, the campus is hence well equipped with 2 halls, a mini-theatre, regular classrooms and several special rooms, including the Maker Lab, GeoScience Lab, Chit Chat Zone, Mathematics Room, Computer Room, Student Activity Room, Dancing Room, Library, Self-Study Room, Life Education Centre, Emmanuel, Fitness Room, Music Room, Music Balcony, Chinese Literature Room and Art Pro. All classrooms are equipped with air-conditioners, computers, projectors and smart interactive boards in order to provide a comfortable and conducive teaching and learning environment.

To facilitate the development of Global Classroom, Video Conference Rooms were set up for students to have a cultural and academic exchange with our sister schools.

School Management

School-based management is implemented in our school. All teachers are invited to participate in decision-making. Parents and alumni are also invited to provide suggestions on the school policy by joining the Parents and Teachers Association and Alumni Association. All school policies are approved by the Executive Committee Meeting and announced in the Staff Meeting.

Three-year School Plan is formulated every 3 years. Annual School Plan is proposed based on the Three-year School Plan. Evaluation workshop is organized to evaluate the effectiveness of the school policy. Three-year School Plan, Annual School Plan and School Report should be approved by The Incorporated Management Committee and uploaded in the school website before November. 3 Incorporated Management Committee Meetings are held every year and the composition is as follows:

(2) Achievements and Reflection on Major Concerns; Feedback and Follow-up 2022-2023

Major Concern 1:

Cultivating the "Happydemic" Atmosphere and Fostering Talented, Virtuous and Blessed Lutheranians

Achievements

Target 1: To deepen the overall planning and promotion of Values Education.

- A task force was formed to coordinate the planning and teaching of the 6 Lutheranians' virtues and the 10 priority values and attitudes proposed by the Education Bureau in different subject departments.
- Value Education activities on specific values were successfully organized by Religion Committee, Extra-Curricular Activities Committee, Discipline Committee, Counseling Committee, Moral and Civic Education Committee and National Security Working Group. The effectiveness of promoting relevant values was evaluated and concrete recommendations for improvements were proposed in their departments' programme evaluation.
- 98% of teachers had a positive attitude towards the promotion of Values Education and believed that it facilitated students' growth.
- 97% of students believed that the promotion of Values Education in school helped them understand values and grow.
- 2 parent talks were held on Parents' Day with the theme of "Toleration is precious, Self-discipline" (百忍豈止可成金) and "6A Conduct Education" (6A 品格教育).
- 2 Values Education Home Letters were prepared. 3 sharing sessions on Values Education were held in form of morning assembly and radio broadcast.

Target 2: To strengthen the connection with other parts of school sponsoring body (churches, houses, schools) in the district.

- S1 Blessing Ceremony and Inauguration of Student Leaders were successfully held.
- 100% of relevant personnel of the school sponsoring body and colleagues were satisfied with the arrangement and believed that it could facilitate the infiltration of the school sponsoring body's values.
- 96% of participants believed that the measures could enhance their understanding of the core beliefs of The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Hong Kong.
- 94% of students concerned agreed that the formulation of Association of Social Service Leaders could enhance their leadership skills.
- S2 student leaders were trained effectively. 100% of S2 team leaders were satisfied with the training arrangement.
- 98% of S2 students believed that the service year's activities helped them understand the meaning of service.
- 100% of the activities held in S2 social service year were direct service.
- 8 online service sessions with students from the ELCHK Lutheran School were held successfully.
- 92% of participants had a positive attitude towards the measures and believed that the measures facilitated their learning and growth.

Target 3: To broaden and deepen the scope of career planning.

- The Global Project connecting 4 sister schools in Mainland China and Japan was successfully held in 2023.
- Student presentations were smoothly conducted in the sharing session.
- 100% of teachers concerned believed that these exchange activities helped students understand the country.

- 92% of students had a better understanding of our country by joining the teacher-student exchange activities, i.e., The Global Project (G Project) with the sister school in Mainland China and Chinese Language's Realtime Virtual Tour in Mainland China.
- 97% of the students understood more about the latest development of modern China through 22 sessions of Speech under the National Flag (國旗下講話) delivered by teachers and students during the morning assemblies.
- S5 CSD Mainland Study Tour was successfully held on 12 April 2023. 144 S5 students (96%) and 17 teachers visited Shenzhen to understand more about the development of innovation and technology.
- 100% of the teachers believed that these activities helped them understand the development of the Greater Bay Area.
- 91% of the students understood more about the innovation and technological development of the Greater Bay Area by joining the CSD Mainland Study Tour.

Target 4: To provide room for students to refresh themselves.

- Class-based refreshing days were successfully held.
- 100% of class teachers believed that the afternoon activities on Refreshing Days could enhance students' affective and social performance.
- 95% of students had positive feedback on the test arrangement (only the core subjects and IS were included in the Uniform Test) and believed that the measure could facilitate their learning.
- The number of assignment was limited to 4 pieces per day.
- 95% of students appreciated the homework policy (limiting the number of assignments and quizzes per day) to ease the burden for junior forms and senior forms, and agreed that the measure could facilitate their learning.

Target 5: To cultivate a Positive Campus Culture.

- Thanksgiving Day was successfully held on 8 March 2023.
- 98% of students had positive feedback on Thanksgiving Day and believed that it facilitated their growth.
- 96% of students agreed that the Thanksgiving Day helped to deepen their sense of gratitude.
- The number of appreciations shown by teachers towards students in eClass increased by around 132% after the implementation of the new awarding system designed to encourage its use by teachers.
- 96% of teachers showed appreciation towards students in eClass.
- 95% of students had positive feedback on "Happydemic" assembly and believed that it facilitated their growth.
- 2 Counselling Talks on positive thinking and appreciation of themselves were held in the assemblies.
- 97% of students had positive feedback on the positive class ethos and knew how to appreciate themselves and others.
- All students wrote "A Letter Home" and gave to parents on Parents' Day.

Target 6: To cultivate "Happydemic" atmosphere among teachers.

- Teachers and staff were allowed to dress casually on Joyful Thursday and Friday.
- Teachers and staff were also allowed to wear healthy and comfortable shoes to school to further promote well-being in school.
- 94% of teachers and staff had positive feedback on school's awareness of well-being.
- Recreation Club organized 3 staff activities, including yoga class, meditation session and martial art workshop. Participants reported that they felt recharged and refreshed after the activities and there was a significant improvement in teachers' overall well-being.

Reflection

- Target 1: To deepen the overall planning and promotion of Values Education.
- Target 2: To strengthen the connection with other parts of school sponsoring body (churches, houses, schools) in the district.
- Target 3: To broaden and deepen the scope of career planning.
- Target 4: To provide room for students to refresh themselves.
- Target 5: To cultivate a Positive Campus Culture.
- Target 6: To cultivate "Happydemic" atmosphere among teachers.

Most of the targets were successfully achieved because of the following facilitating factors.

- 1. Comprehensive planning and effective collaboration among Student Affairs Committee:
- A task force was established, and regular meetings of the Student Affairs Committee were conducted to plan, coordinate, implement, and evaluate various activities related to Values Education, therefore, the school could formulate well-defined and prioritised targets.
- Revised format of programme plan helped demonstrate the elements of the 6 Lutheranians' virtues and the 10 priority values and attitudes proposed by the Education Bureau in different subject departments and committees.
- 2. Strong connection with other parts of the school sponsoring body in the district:
- With the support and involvement of the School Sponsoring Body The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Hong Kong, and different entities within the school sponsoring body in the district (e.g. The ELCHK Tin Yiu Life Lutheran Church), it greatly facilitated the integration of the sponsoring body's relevant values into the school. It enabled the school to offer more opportunities for students to experience the holistic development and foster student growth with positive values.
- 3. Strong support from parents, alumni, and the community:
- With the collaboration and support from the Parents and Teachers Association, the Alumni Association, and the Evangelical Lutheran Church Social Service - Hong Kong, the school was able to provide students with appropriate support services and a diverse range of learning experiences. This support was particularly crucial for the successful implementation of school events, such as Thanksgiving Day, Life-wide Learning Activity Day, and the S2 Social Service Year.
- 4. Widespread support in advocating the "Happydemic Atmosphere" within the school community:
- This initiative aimed to create a positive and joyful environment for students, staff, and the entire school community, especially during the Post-COVID period. To achieve this, the school implemented a revised homework policy, which limited the number of assignments and quizzes per day. Additionally, a monthly refreshing day was introduced, providing an opportunity for students and staff to rejuvenate and focus on their well-being. These measures had successfully cultivated a culture of promoting well-being in the school.
- 5. Full Resumption of Face-to-face classes:
- Under the full resumption of face-to-face classes in September, all school activities were resumed as normal and an all-rounded learning experience was provided for students.
- 6. Efforts made by the School Executive Members:
- By conducting the mid-term review and adopting the performance indicators to evaluate the progress, school executive members strived to refine the school measures from time to time, which helped to achieve the above-mentioned targets in a whole-school approach.

Some of hindering factors that could be taken into account:

- 1. Guiding students with higher learning expectations in volitional and practical dimensions across different domains is essential for optimizing the design of lesson plans in Values Education-related activities.
- 2. Enhancing students' understanding and motivation to participate in the value education activities: Talks and sharing sessions provided students with a deeper understanding of the 6 Lutheranians' virtues, which could enable them to grasp their significance in daily life and boost their enthusiasm and engagement.

Feedback and Follow-up

- The lesson plan of the Religious Education would be refined so that students would be guided with higher learning expectations in volitional and practical dimensions in different domains (e.g. personal, family, community, national and global domains.).
- Activities with relevant values would continue to be carried out by different departments and committees, which would focus more on the volitional and practical dimensions in different domains of Values Education.
- Talks or sharing sessions should be held by different committees to help students better understand the importance of 6 Lutheranians' virtues.
- To commemorate the school's 65th anniversary, the 65th anniversary logo would be put on the greeting cards and wooden box. The significance of the Sapphire Jubilee would be emphasized during the S1 Blessing Ceremony, Inauguration of Student Leaders, and Speech Day.
- The theme "Shine in Happydemic" highlights the unwavering dedication of our students, who continue to shine brightly under divine grace. Just like a Sapphire Jubilee, we never forget our mission and remain committed to bringing glory to God and benefiting others.
- During the retreat, the core beliefs of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Hong Kong would be emphasized to provide new teachers with a deeper understanding of our mission.
- The service-learning leadership training programme would be refined to cater for the needs of S4 student leaders in each class, in order to provide students with enhanced skills and knowledge to serve the community more effectively.
- S4 social service year would be carried out in the next academic year.
- Engaging in direct service and delivering services in a higher quality would be emphasized to make a positive impact on the community.
- A better communication with the ELCHK Lutheran Academy at the beginning of the academic year would facilitate a better planning.
- The mode of voluntary teaching services would transit from online approach to face-to-face approach.
- The G Project with Pinghu Donghu Middle School and teacher-student exchange activities would be held in the next academic year.
- The collaboration mode of G-project would be refined. Teachers of sister schools would be more involved in the planning of the project.
- The modes of sharing could be more diversified, e.g. in pairs, short video format, etc.
- A cultural exchange tour to Xin Jiang would be held in the next academic year to sustain the relationship with Xing Jiang students.
- Increasing student involvement in organizing activities for Refreshing Days is the key to success, as it fosters a greater sense of belonging among students.
- Refining the uniform test arrangement and the homework policy to enhance the well-being of students is not only welcome among students and parents but also crucial in facilitating students' learning. When students' well-being is prioritized, they are better equipped to engage in their studies, develop positive relationships, and thrive academically and emotionally.

- On the Thanksgiving Day, the significance of the Sapphire Jubilee and the theme of "Shine in Happydemic" would be emphasized to celebrate school's 65th anniversary and express gratitude. The Sapphire Jubilee represents the 65th anniversary, symbolizing strength, wisdom, and resilience. It serves as a reminder of the school's enduring commitment to its mission and the blessings received over the years.
- Teachers will continue to be encouraged to show appreciation towards students in eClass, an online platform for teaching and learning. Recognizing and appreciating students' efforts and achievements is essential for their motivation, well-being, and academic growth.
- Exploring different ways to promote a positive class ethos and encourage self-appreciation and peer-appreciation is crucial for creating a supportive and inclusive learning environment.
- Various parent talks with designated themes would be organized.
- 5 Values Education Home Letters of the "Taste of Life" series to parents would be sent by different means.
- Assemblies on the promotion of Sapphire Jubilee, "Shine in Happydemic" and positive attitudes would be a way to inspire students to appreciate themselves and others.
- Measures that encouraged teachers and staff to dress well for their well-being would incorporate
 into the Staff Development and Wellness Committee's programme plan in the next academic
 year.

Major Concern 2:

Implementing Globalized Pedagogical Approaches and Broadening Students' International Perspectives

Achievements

Target 1: To deepen the culture of lesson studies.

- All subjects completed the lesson studies. The primary focus of lesson studies was pre-lesson preparation, the habit of active learning and note taking.
- 100% of teachers believed that the measures were effective in enhancing professionalism and the effectiveness of teaching.
- 100% of teachers believed that the measures were effective in enhancing the culture of lesson study.

Target 2: To increase students' learning flexibility and adopt the Blended Learning Model.

- Around 100 online tutorial classes were conducted in senior form.
- 60 students were admitted to the One-on-One Online English Oral Practice Programme this year, with 178 students applying for the programme.
- One-on-One Online English Oral Practice started in October 2022 with high student attendance rate (98.3%).
- After-school Pull-out Foreign Language Courses were open to S2-S5 students. Japanese courses (N5, N4), Korean courses (TOPIK 1, 2, 3) and German courses (A1, A2, B1) were offered.
- 5 sessions of online small group tutorials / speaking practices / individual coaching / speaking practices were held for each course.
- 65 students participated in the online oral practice programme with external Japanese, German and Korean tutors every year.
- 95% of the students involved believed that the measures facilitated their learning.
- All subjects set up an online assessment platform.
- Senior form students were informed of their accounts and the relevant guidelines to use the online question bank provided by the HKEdcity which included past papers in Mathematics, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, Economics, Geography, ICT and BAFS.

Target 3: To introduce a diversified assessment model.

- All subjects introduced diversified assignment mode, where students could submit their assignments in different media including photos, videos, and drawings.
- All subjects introduced different assignment submission methods.
- VARK test was conducted every year to analyse students' most suitable learning mode(s).
- 96% of students had a positive attitude towards the measures and believed that the measures facilitated their learning.
- 97% of students agreed that diversified assignment mode could improve their learning effectiveness.

Target 4: To enhance the STEM atmosphere - Introducing VR/AR technology in the teaching of each subject.

- STEM Tuesday was held regularly, which included a range of learning activities: Training of Marty the Robot, Micro:bit application, Training of Temi and Flight simulation.
- Robot adoption scheme was continued and conducted in 3 phases.
- 100% of teachers agreed that the relevant measures could enhance the STEM atmosphere in school.
- All subjects adopted VR / AR in their teachings.
- 100% of teachers were satisfied with VR/AR being the teaching support.
- STEM Expo was organized on 7 July 2023. S2 and S3 students participated in the event.
- 89% of participating students had a positive attitude towards the STEM Expo.
- In junior forms, different programming languages were introduced, including Block Coding Languages (App Inventor for S1 and S2 and Python for S3). Elements of AI was newly added to S2 teaching and learning.
- STEM student leaders were recruited to assist in STEM-related activities. 89% of leaders had a positive attitude towards the measures and believed that the measure facilitated their learning.

Target 5: To strengthen the practice of talent search in Gifted Development Programme.

- As of July 2023, 46 external programmes, courses, competitions or talks were promoted.
- 89% of participating students had a positive attitude towards the measures and believed that the measure facilitated their learning.
- A talent pool excel file was created to summarise talent lists of all subject areas. Activities were promoted and recommended to students with reference to the talent pool.
- Self-nomination of students was done and had recruited more students.
- 100% of teachers agreed that the measure facilitated teachers to nurture talented students.

Target 6: To strengthen global interactions and optimize the arrangements of studying abroad.

- 3 on-site overseas study tours were held this year (Japan, the UK and Switzerland and Scotland), with 115 participants.
- 5 virtual tours were held this year, with 283 participants.
- A talk on overseas studies was organized.
- 100% of teachers were satisfied with the support on overseas studies.
- Global project was carried out online in the second term (with 34 participants) in collaboration with 4 sister schools in Mainland China, Hong Kong and Japan.
- 12 online courses provided by overseas universities were promoted via digital means. 89% of students had a positive attitude towards the measures and believed that the measures facilitated their learning and growth.
- 2 talks on further studies in Japan were held and 2 information talks given by mainland universities were promoted via parent notice. 90% of participating parents were satisfied with the arrangement and believed that it helped to enhance their understanding of overseas studies.
- Information concerning language proficiency tests were given to students. A small number of students took the tests and obtained accredited qualification.

Reflection

- Target 1: To deepen the culture of lesson studies.
- Target 2: To increase students' learning flexibility and adopt the Blended Learning Model.
- Target 3: To introduce a diversified assessment model.
- Target 4: To enhance the STEM atmosphere Introducing VR/AR technology in the teaching of each subject.
- Target 5: To strengthen the practice of talent search in Gifted Development Programme.
- Target 6: To strengthen global interactions and optimize the arrangements of studying abroad.

Most of the targets were successfully achieved because of the following facilitating factors.

- 1. Widespread support in the implementation of active learning culture in school:
- 3 lesson studies in different levels, including junior and senior level were conducted successfully. Each subject panel continued to conduct lesson studies that focused on active learning, particularly on enhancing students' positive attitudes and habits of active learning.
- 2. Teachers' and Students' Enthusiasm in STEM:
- Teachers and students had a sound foundation with the use of technology in teaching and learning, allowing the smooth implementation of blended learning and diversified assessment model.
- For STEM Expo, there were 13 booths where students presented their prototypes and 16 booths showcasing their ideations. Students showed their confidence in presenting their products.
- In the junior form CL curriculum, AI tools like ChatGPT, PdfGPT and Simple AI Chatbot would be introduced. Information Literacy would be strengthened.
- STEM leaders would hold ECAs like STEM Tuesday which include Robot demo and Micro:bit workshop. They would act as demonstrators on Information Day and STEM Expo.
- 3. Active participation in online English oral practice programme and foreign language:
- The school has established firm connections with sister schools from different regions, service providers and external organisations. These connections and collaborations have resulted in abundant opportunities for students to explore their interests and polish their language skills.
- By joining forces with the English Department and International Cultural Exchange Committee, numerous students have enthusiastically signed up for the online English oral practice program and foreign language courses.
- The departments' teachers and committee members have been proactively reaching out to interested students, providing them with ample opportunities to unlock their full potential.

Some hindering factors that could be taken into account:

- More school-based gifted education development programmes should be organized to better suit the needs of more able students and track the development of talents.
- More occasions are needed for foreign language students to validate their language competence through different means (including in-course assessments and external, accredited language proficiency tests.).
- Some students could not participate in the above program due to the limited number of study places.

Feedback and Follow-up

- The primary focus of lesson study would continue to be placed on active learning. On top of the previous focuses, more emphasis would be placed on note processing skills. The use of Cornell note taking method would be incorporated into the planning and teaching of each subject.
- More students (At least 100) will participate in the online English oral practice programme. The flexibility of online English oral tutorial sessions can be further increased by allowing students to choose their preferred sessions. Also, students can choose the topics of conversation/ discussion in online oral practice programme with external foreign language tutors.
- A diversified range of learning assessments should be provided for students to cater for learning diversity, facilitating their learning abilities and interests.
- Arts elements would be added on STEAM development.
- More awards were acquired in inter-school competitions related to STEAM.
- STEAM Tuesday, Robot adoption Scheme and STEAM ECA courses would be organized.
- VR/AR materials chosen should provide students with a more realistic and tangible experience
 of the concepts they are studying, which can deepen their understanding and lead to better
 retention of information.
- The curriculum of Computer Literacy would be refined in junior form to enhance students' interest in STEAM and their information literacy.
- The STEM Expo would be upgraded to STEAM Expo; in which arts elements would be incorporated.
- STEAM Expo should nurture students' creativity, collaboration, problem solving skills and innovativeness through encouraging the creation of more prototypes next year.
- The talent pool will be expanded to cover non-academic areas.
- More able students would be nourished through school-based gifted development programmes, to enhance their high-order thinking skills, creativity and personal-social competence.
- Elements of real-time virtual tours could be integrated in on-site overseas study tours in the future.
- Students would be encouraged to take accredited language proficiency tests as they apply for foreign language courses. More feedback on performance and in-class mock tests in the layout of the proficiency tests would be included in the courses.

(3) Student Performance

- A brief account of students' attitude and behavior:
 - Based on the newly introduced APASO III survey conducted in late-April 2023 and observations, our students' performance in terms of sense of satisfaction in school, not being alone in school, and sense of belonging in school surpassed the average in the Hong Kong territory-wide norm. Additionally, our students' performance in terms of the absence of negative emotions also surpassed the average in the Hong Kong territory-wide norm. However, their positive emotions and absence of anxiety and depressive symptoms were lower than the average in the Hong Kong territory-wide norm. To address these lower levels, we would further promote a positive and supportive school environment, cultivate a Happydemic atmosphere and foster a positive campus culture.

Our students' performance in terms of goals of life, honesty, and ethical conduct surpassed the average in the Hong Kong territory-wide norm. Revised format of the programme plan helped demonstrate the elements of the 6 Lutheranians' virtues and the 10 priority values and attitudes proposed by the Education Bureau in different subject departments and committees. However, our students' level of physical training was lower than the average in the Hong Kong territory-wide norm. To address this, we would introduce more diverse and new sports to our students.

Our students' performance in terms of reading (non-assigned reading, leisure reading time) and Information Technology (less commonly used for leisure time, non-addictive, and not drawn to functionality) surpassed the average in the Hong Kong territory-wide norm.

Our students' performance in terms of national identity (responsibility, obligations, pride, affection, national flag, national anthem, and achievements) surpassed the average in the Hong Kong territory-wide norm.

Our school participated in the "2023 Hong Kong Children Happiness Index" survey conducted by STEAM Education and Research Centre, Lingnan University, in collaboration with The Hong Kong Pediatric Society Department of Pediatrics, The University of Hong Kong, and the Department of Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine, The Chinese University of Hong Kong. The survey results indicated that our students' average happiness index surpassed the territory-wide average.

Additionally, the survey revealed that our students' average study pressure was lower than the territory-wide average. The survey reflected that within the Happydemic atmosphere, students perceived academic pressure as a driving force for their learning. It also demonstrated that the various measures implemented by the school to create a conducive learning environment effectively reduced students' academic stress.

Furthermore, the survey indicated that our students' average activity pressure was lower than the territory-wide average. The survey reflected that our students could strike a good balance between studies and extra-curricular activities, and they greatly enjoyed their school life.

Lastly, the survey also indicated that our students' average rate of not being bullied was higher than the territory-wide average. The survey reflected a positive trend in terms of students experiencing a lower incidence of bullying was found in our school.
